Our Mission

Vision Rehabilitation Center of the Ozarks (VRCO) provides services to people of all ages regardless of their ability to pay. The latest technologies for low vision care are not covered by insurance. Patients face great challenges completing daily activities without proper vision care and assistive devices.

Since opening its doors in 2010, **VRCO** has helped over 2,000 people maintain independence through specialized vision care and the use of adaptive technology. **VRCO** has worked with more than 150 children, ages birth to three, and their families learn how to do things like explore their environment safely, prepare them for using braille, and transition into the school system.

Thank you for helping **VRCO** continue to provide these needed services and equipment. It is through the continued support of the community that we are able to help magnify the quality of life for people with vision impairments.
